

What is a Registered Psychologist?

In Ontario, the term Psychologist refers to a licensed practitioner with doctoral (Ph.D.) level training who has completed at least one year of supervised practice as a provider of psychological services. During their doctoral training, psychologists are trained to assess, diagnose and treat a broad range of emotional, behavioural and cognitive difficulties that people face in their everyday lives. The doctoral training takes approximately nine years, so psychologists have completed numerous hours of instruction and contact with clients by the time they receive their degree. As part of the registration process with the College of Psychologist of Ontario, a psychologist must have completed two written and one oral examinations, ensuring that members of the public receive services that adhere to strict standards of practice and ethical conduct.
